The dramatic transformation of the Middle East resulting from the “Arab Spring” will be the focus of lectures as the Amram Scholar Series launches its 2011–12 season. America’s former Ambassador to Israel, Martin Indyk — currently a Vice President and Director of the Foreign Policy Program at The Brookings Institution— will join us at Temple on **Sunday, October 16** to speak on *Israel and the Arab Awakenings*.

Ambassador Indyk brings extraordinary insight to the still-unfolding geopolitical and diplomatic realities confronting Israel, not only in view of the Arab Spring, but also of the Palestinian request for statehood, now pending in the United Nations. Ambassador Indyk represented the United States in Israel from 1995 to 1997 and again in 2000 and 2001. During the Clinton Administration he also served as Assistant Secretary of State for Near Eastern Affairs and Special Assistant to the President. He has written extensively on foreign policy issues.
