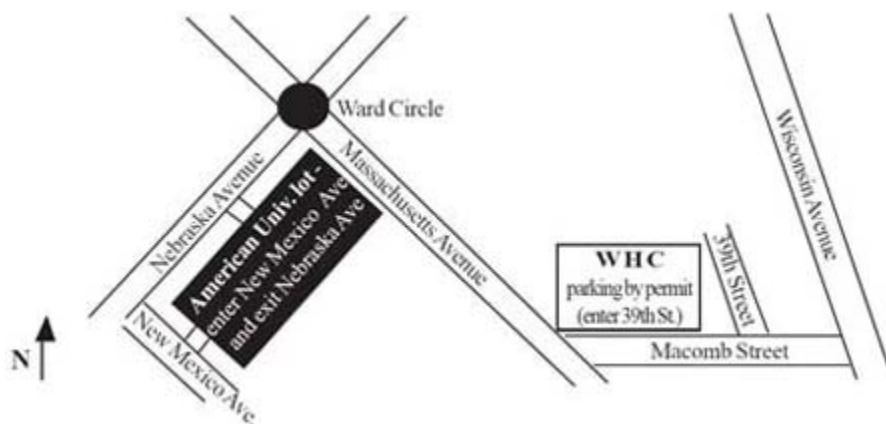
HIGH HOLIDAY LOGISTICS & PARKING GUIDE

One of the greatest joys at Washington Hebrew Congregation is the large number of congregants we serve, but it is also one of its greatest challenges at the High Holiday season. In preparation for the congregation to come together to worship, the Washington Hebrew staff is making every effort to make this year's services run smoothly.

Off-Site Parking

In order to minimize congestion, arrangements for off-site parking have been made with American University. This is the most convenient and pleasant way to park for services. Please use the AU parking lot west of Ward Circle at the intersection of Nebraska and New Mexico Avenues, NW. Shuttle buses will be running throughout the holidays for convenient, no-hassle parking and will drop you off directly in front of the Temple. Take advantage of this cost-free transportation service and meet your fellow congregants on the way to Temple!

Shuttle Bus Service

Shuttle bus service is as follows:

- Rosh Hashanah Eve and Kol Nidre beginning at 5:00 pm
- Rosh Hashanah Day and Yom Kippur beginning at 8:00 am.

Buses will be available immediately after services to return congregants to the Ward Circle lot. Please allow 20-25 minutes for the shuttle so you will not be late for your service.

Street Parking

If you decide to drive directly to Temple and find street parking, normal time-limited parking restrictions will be lifted during the High Holy Days. Specifically, two-hour parking restrictions will be lifted in the McLean Gardens neighborhood. Included in this area are 38th and 39th Streets, Newark Avenue, Porter Street, Rodman Street, Idaho Avenue, and Macomb Street. Restrictions, however, cannot be removed for Massachusetts Avenue during rush hour traffic. Parking on Mass Avenue is prohibited during the following times: *Outbound*: 4:00-6:30 pm; *Inbound*: 7:00-9:30 am. In addition, parking restrictions cannot be removed for Wisconsin Avenue.

For the safety of all, congregants are reminded to obey all traffic regulations. Please remember that WHC is located in a residential area. Please respect the property, comfort, and safety of our neighbors. We would appreciate it if congregants do not park in front of private driveways or in other restricted areas.

Temple Parking

Space in the Temple parking lot is very limited and is permitted only with a special WHC High Holiday Parking Pass. Some passes are still available for certain services; please contact the Ticket Office with requests. A government-issued handicapped parking tag is not sufficient to gain entry to the parking lot.

Handicapped Accommodations

A wheelchair ramp is available at the Edlavitch Hall entrance on Macomb Street. A chair glide is now available at the parking lot entrance for those who have difficulty walking down the stairs.
